Mahatma Gandhi declared Vinoba Bhave as his spiritual heir. Once, when Vinoba Bhave was delivering lecture at Pochampalli, some poor landless farmers demanded land, he could not promise them immediately but assured them to talk to the government of India. Suddenly Mr. Ram Chandra Reddy stood up and offered 80 acres of land. This act was known as Bhoodan. Later some zamindars offered to distribute some villages among the landess. It was known as Gramdan. Many landowners chose to provide some part of their land due to the fear of land ceiling act. This Bhoodan–Gramdan movement initiated by Vinoba Bhave is also known as the Blood-less Revolution.


